
THE **EXECUTIVE BRANCH:** ENFORCER OF LAWS

Our system of Checks and Balances:



The Executive Branch is headed by the **President**:

| ELIGIBILITY TO HOLD OFFICE | TERMS OF OFFICE |

| Native Born citizen | Serve 4 year terms |
| At least 35 years old | No more than 2 terms or 10 |
| U.S. resident for 14 years | years (extra years due VP |

The order of Presidential **Succession** should he/she leave office:

- 1. Vice President
- 2. Speaker of the House of Representatives
- **3.** The president *pro tempore* of the Senate (majority leader)
- 4. Members of the cabinet in the order in which the departments were created.


The President gets help from **Cabinet** positions:

| Executive Department | Leader of the Cabinet | Date Established and Department Focus |

| Department of State | Secretary of State | 1789: Foreign policy and international relations |
| Department of the Treasury | Secretary of the Treasury | 1789: Collect revenue (taxes), coining and printing money, and economic policy |
| Department of Defense | Secretary of Defense | 1789: United States military and national defense |
| Department of Justice | Attorney General | Attorney General position was created in 1789: Law enforcement and prevention |
| Department of the Interior | Secretary of the Interior | 1849: Protects the nation's national and cultural resources along with Native American |
| Department of Agriculture | Secretary of Agriculture | relations 1889: Policy relating to farming, food safety, and hunger |
| Department of Commerce | Secretary of Commerce | 1903: Economic development and policy |
